



Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type This product is issued under Austrian law and entitles the respective holder to receive any amount due from us as the Issuer (bearer form).

Objectives The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional coupon payments and (2) a cash payment on the **maturity date**. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the **maturity date**.
Coupon: On each **coupon payment date** you will receive a coupon payment of USD 15.00 if the **reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **coupon barrier level** on the immediately preceding **coupon observation date**. If this condition is not met, you will receive no coupon payment on such **coupon payment date**. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: On termination of the product on the **maturity date** you will receive USD 1,000.00.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include proportionate accrued coupon.

knowledge and/or experience with financial products. The investor can bear no or only small losses on the capital invested and is willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 4 months and 3 weeks. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The average returns shown in the above table are not annualised, which means they may not be comparable to the average returns shown in other key information documents.

This table shows the money you could get back over the next 4 months and 3 weeks under different scenarios, assuming that you invest USD 10,000.

The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. The recommended holding period for this product is less than one year. The figures are therefore not calculated on a per year basis, but for the recommended holding period. Figures in this section and "4. This product cannot be easily cashed in. This means it is difficult to estimate how much you would get back if you cash in before maturity. You will either be unable to cash in early or you will have to pay high costs or make a large loss if you do so.

3. What happens if Raiffeisen Centrobank AG is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the issuer might be unable to meet its obligations in connection with the product for instance in the event of bankruptcy or in case of certain resolution measures ordered by the respective resolution authority in case of a crisis of the issuer. In that case the resolution authority has a wide-ranging power to take actions, e.g. to reduce the claims of the investors up to zero, to terminate or convert the products into shares of the issuer, to suspend rights of the issuer ("Bail-In"). 4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 4 months and 3 weeks

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 13 May 2021 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
